MARRIAGE PRAYER RALLIES TO BE HELD AT MP OFFICES ACROSS CANADA

Canadians are uniting together from coast to coast to pray for and declare the sanctity of marriage at MP constituency offices across Canada on Sunday, September 7th. Each prayer rally will be held at 3:00 p.m. local time. Local clergy are leading the prayer, and Members of Parliament have been invited to briefly address the gatherings.

“The purpose is to bring together Christians of all denominations, Jews, and all others who want to express support for marriage as a sacred institution— a voluntary, life-long covenant between one man and one woman, ” says Brian Rushfeldt, Executive Director of Canada Family Action Coalition (CFAC), which is coordinating the rallies.

It is absurd that the federal government would allow a few judges to dictate the definition of marriage to Canadians, Rushfeldt adds. “Decisions regarding marriage, and other fundamental social issues, should be made by elected officials supporting the will of the people, not appointed judges. The federal government should have appealed the court rulings that declared the definition of marriage unconstitutional. Instead, the Liberal cabinet has been drafting new legislation that reflects the judges’ personal opinions dictating same sex ‘marriages.’”

Dr. Charles McVety, CFAC’s Board Director who is networking religious leaders across Canada in support of this event, says, “Most leaders of major denominations and faith groups, representing 8 to 9 million Canadians who regularly attend a place of worship, are outraged by the government’s invasion in the fundamental institution of marriage. Therefore they are instructing their clergy to rise up on September 7th, riding by riding, across the nation, to pray for and declare the sanctity of marriage.”

Dr. McVety adds, “Canadians have had enough. The desecration of the sacred institution of marriage will not be accepted and will not go unchallenged. The sleeping giant is awake, and it will no longer be silent.”
